The Chair is embedded in the Department of Sociology, which, with a total of 15 professorships, is one of the leading facilities for sociology in Germany and cooperates closely with other research institutions, e.g. the Leibniz Institute for Educational Trajectories (<u>https://www.uni-bamberg.de/en/sociology/study/</u>).
